²For those students whose major instrument is percussion: substitute ME 191, 192, 291, 292, 391, or 392 for ME 193.

- At least 40 credits must be at the 300-level or higher.
- A grade of C or higher is required for all Music courses.
- Music majors fulfill the following areas of the University Core Curriculum: Perspectives in the Creative Arts requirement (because they take 9 credit hours in the arts) and the Butler Cultural Requirement (BCR).
