All Butler students must fulfill the Indianapolis Community Requirement by taking one course designated ICR; music majors must fulfill the Arts Event Attendance requirements found on the Jordan College of the Arts website for each semester of enrollment as a music major.

NOTE: In addition to general Butler transfer requirements noted in the application process, the Jordan College of the Arts requires an audition for acceptance into the Butler University School of Music.
